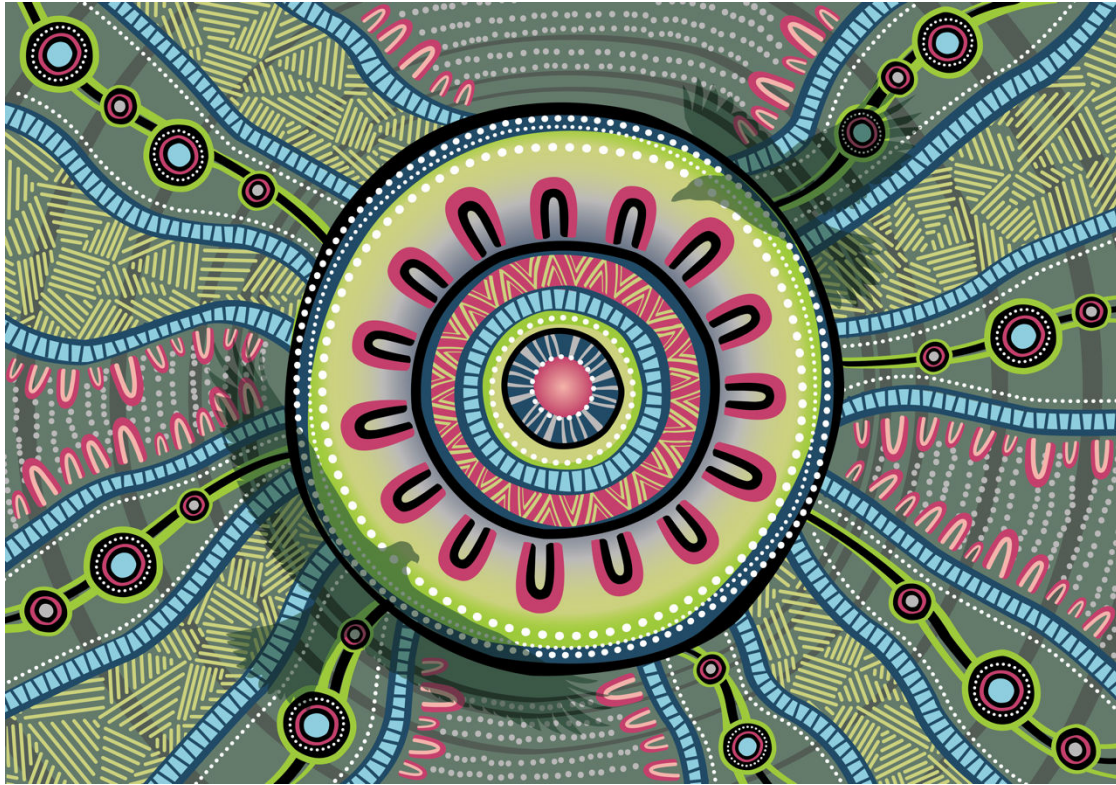


The Knight

Guwalnila garrulyenek guwalnila depicts the connection and collaboration between The Knight and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to reflect The Knight’s commitment to reconciliation. The central yarning circle is featured as a communal meeting place to work together and build meaningful relationships to promote cultural awareness, knowledge and understanding. The six rings that form the central yarning circle represent The Knight’s 6 core values. Green meeting places connected by journey lines emerge from the yarning circle and depict channels of growth and engagement representing The Knight’s ongoing Reconciliation Journey and development of meaningful impact within The Knight’s sphere of influence.

The cultural values of caring for Country align with The Knight’s commitment to protection and sustainability. Blue lines and green chevron pattern depict traditional lands and waterways; protecting Mother Earth is integral to cultural survival and embeds the significance of connection to Country.

The creator spirits of Bunjil and Waa respectfully acknowledge the location of The Knight’s offices on Bunurong and Wurundjeri Countries. Their transparent silhouettes symbolise the presence of ancestral spirits protecting the wellbeing of community and Country and overseeing The Knight’s Reconciliation Journey.
